# RULES OF SHOW

## THESE RULES WILL BE STRICTLY ADHERED TO

- 1 Entry forms and fees due, will be received in the Memorial Hall between 6.00 pm and 8.00 pm on Friday 11<sup>th</sup> September 2015. □
- 2 Classes are open to Club Members, all villagers and allotment holders of Wardington, Williamscot and Coton, including children (see rules 6 and 7).  
**Classes 41, 42 and 43 are OPEN TO FRIEND AND FAMILIES as stated in rule 2.**
- 3 All exhibits must be grown or made by the exhibitor except where indicated on the schedule.
- 4 Handicrafts should not have been exhibited in this show before.
- 5 Exhibitors may show only one entry in any one class.
- 6 In Section E the age of the exhibitor – 14 years and under - must be shown to qualify for free entry.
- 7 Children may enter all adult classes, but the standard adult fee of 20p will be required.
- 8 The Hall will be open at 8.30 am. Produce **must** be staged by 10.30 am on show day, after which the doors will be locked.
- 9 **Show open to the Public from 2.30 pm with auction at 4.00 pm.**
- 10 Raffle Draw and Auction will commence immediately after the show closes.
- 11 Infringements of these rules shall disqualify the exhibit.
- 12 **We would appreciate exhibitors leaving their produce for the auction, but please remove by 3.50pm if not for sale. Thanks.**

<b>Section A</b>	<b><u>TOP TRAY</u></b>
1	Class is for a collection of vegetables – made up of any 4 classes from section B (exhibit the stated number as shown in that class.) Size of tray not to exceed 24” (60cm) x 18” (45cm). All vegetables must be displayed within these confines. Tray may be dressed, but only with parsley.

2	Potatoes - 4 - kidney or round
3	Cabbage – leaving 5cm stem
4	Runner Beans – 5
5	French Beans – 5
6	Longest Runner Bean
7	Onions - Sets 4 – dressed
8	Sweetcorn – 2
9	Carrots - 3 - short, long or stumped - with 3” (75mm) stalk
10	Parsnips - 2 - with 3” (75 mm) stalk
11	Beetroot - 3 - with 3” (75 mm) stalk

<b>Section C</b>	<b><u>FLOWERS</u></b>
25	Roses - Floribunda - 1 stem
26	Roses - 3 blooms of one variety
27	Rose - 1 bloom, grown for fragrance
28	Garden flowers - 6 stems - mixed fresh flowers to be grown by exhibitor - judged on condition; packing or oasis can be used
29	Geranium blooms – two cut stems, any colours
30	Orchid – pot grown
31	Collection of grasses – max height 60cm/2 foot
32	Dahlias - 3 of a kind, any variety
33	Autumn berries – 1 stem of 3 different varieties
34	Geranium - one in a pot
35	Pot Plant - 1 - flowering (pot not to exceed 8” (20cm)
36	Pot Plant - 1 - fern or foliage (pot not to exceed 10” - 25cm).
37	Cactus or Succulent - any sized pot
38	Pot grown Fuchsia - pot not to exceed 8” (20cm)
39	A variety of Foliage - any container - not an arrangement, leaves only, no flowers
40	Hydrangea – 3 blooms
<b>Section D</b>	<b><u>FLOWER ARRANGING</u></b>
	<b>Flowers may be purchased, if desired Classes 41, 42 and 43 may also be entered by <u>‘friends and family’ - see rule 2</u></b>
41	‘Raise your glass’ – an arrangement in a tall champagne-type glass
42	Arrangement in a sea shell
43	Fresh flower arrangement for a round dining table – no larger than approximately 12” in diameter
